

HISTORY OF THE AUCKLAND ASSOCIATION

It is believed that the Auckland Croquet Association was established by the clubs in Auckland in 1899, as the Centenary of the ACA was held in 1999.

Unfortunately early records of the ACA were lost and the first available information dates from the mid 1950s.

Croquet was brought to NZ from England by early settlers after 1850 and garden croquet was a popular game at that time. The first formal croquet club was formed as part of the Ponsonby Lawn Tennis Club in 1879.

The following article was written by the late Mr Arthur Ross for Mrs Moffitt, a former President (1962-63) of the Auckland Croquet Association.

"Croquet is one of the oldest British games, having been played in one form or other for hundreds of years, but it has only emerged in its present highly scientific form in the closing years of the 1800's. There were croquet clubs in many parts of New Zealand at that period, but the first district organisation was not set up until 1899 when the Auckland clubs combined to form the Auckland Croquet Association. This body has functioned ever since and had quite a lot to do with the formation of the New Zealand Croquet Council in the years following the First World War, and as such must be regarded as the Senior Association in the Dominion."

There is no reference to which clubs formed the original association. Many clubs have disappeared and are only remembered by family members who recall their parents playing or being taken to watch them play. There were once clubs in Onehunga, Mt Eden, Rocky Nook, Winstone Park, Remuera and Mt Hobson and no doubt there were others.


Croquet players were mainly women and many croquet clubs were associated with bowling clubs because women were excluded from playing bowls, so they played croquet instead.

In 1920 the New Zealand Croquet Council was formed and its first President was Mr E. Ross, the father of Arthur Ross.

INTERNATIONAL CROQUET

International Croquet was born in 1925 with play between UK and Australia. New Zealand soon joined in when the MacRobertson Shield was first contested and New Zealand players were introduced to world class play where they have met with considerable success. This renown was enhanced by the success of our players at the inaugural meeting of the World Croquet Federation Championships in 1989 when Auckland Bob Jackson was the winner of the doubles event with Joseph Hogan. Auckland players have distinguished themselves extensively in both Australia and the USA. Currently there are 16 Aucklanders in the top 540 World Ranking player list, with Bob Jackson at No 6.

WORLD CLASS AUCKLANDERS



Bob Jackson has done just about everything in croquet and has particularly stamped his mark on the New Zealand Open. In 25 years he has contested the final no less than 22 times winning for the 13th time in 1999. A peeling fiend Bob has completed no less than 46 Sextuple Peels in tournament play, including three Octuples, two of these were with the smooth Australian balls.

Although he has never won a World Championship, other than the doubles he won with Joseph Hogan in 1989, Bob is widely acclaimed as one of the best players in the world today.

An extract from The Listener, March 13 1999, gives credit to Bob Jackson. "Jackson is one of New Zealand's greatest and least heralded sportsmen. Not only is the 67 year old a legend in croquet, but before taking up croquet he was an equally good Table Tennis player.

He did not take up croquet until 1971 and since then has enjoyed almost unbroken success. As in table tennis, he wins by persistence, concentration and tactical acumen rather than power or style.

Jackson gained world fame in croquet in 1989 by completing octuple peels in successive games during the North Island champs at Napier. At the time, no one in the world had managed even one octuple peel."



CLUBS OF THE PAST

Although ACA is celebrating its Centenary, croquet play was recorded in Auckland as early as 1861. When the Auckland Bowling Club was formed in 1861 in Grafton Gully, provision was made for Archery and Quoits. Interest in Quoits did not last and the Archery moved to Government House so the land was then made available for Croquet and Tennis. During the 1890's provision was made for the tethering of players' horses, but this raised protest and complaint about the safety of the croquet players' children. In 1905, the croquet players renewed their lease and in the 1940's obtained more land, but this was later taken over by the lady bowlers and the Croquet Club closed sometime later.

Auckland has seen many clubs started and closed in the past 100 years. Some which can be traced are Herne Bay, Onehunga (last reference 1965), Mt Eden, Northcote and Stanley Bay (1964), East Tamaki and Hillsborough in 1958. There were also a United and Parnell Club. Glen Eden shared land with the bowling club, but had no official lease – another club to lose out to bowlers. Along with players from the Western Districts, most Glen Eden members moved to Henderson Club. Mt. Hobson, headquarters and the home of so many tournaments and championships was lost the bulldozer in 1982. More recently Winston Park closed in 1997 due to diminishing membership and Remuera was also lost to the bowling club in 1995.

A record in the Pt Chevalier Minute Book of 1929 – 1937 shows the following clubs were listed as members of the ACA.

It is worth recording the trials of two of the most recent clubs to close.

ORDER OF DEBATE:

- (a) Every Motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded and when this has been done it shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the majority of the members present;
- (b) Every Amendment shall be relevant to the Motion on which it is moved, and no substantive motion shall be received under colour of an amendment;
- (c) When an amendment to a Motion has been moved and seconded, no other amendment shall be moved until the first has been disposed of;
- (d) If an amendment has been rejected, other amendments, in order, may be moved on the original Motion;
- (e) If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion and shall become the main question, upon which any further amendment may be moved;
- (f) A Motion or Amendment may be amended by the mover and seconder with the consent of the majority of the members present;
- (g) A Motion "that the Council do now adjourn" or "that the Council do now proceed to the next business or "that the debate be now adjourned" may be moved at any time, but no speech shall be allowed in moving or seconding either motion, and no second or further motion to the same effect shall be made within half an hour;
- (h) A member when speaking to a resolution, shall stand and address the Chair, and if two or more members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall decide to whom priority shall be given;
- (i) A member shall direct his speech strictly to the motion or amendment under discussion, or to a motion or amendment to be proposed by himself, or to a question of order;
- (j) A member shall not address the Council more than once on any motion or amendment, except as hereafter provided, but the mover of an original motion may reply and in his reply shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate, but the mover of an amendment shall have no right of reply.
- (k) A member may, by permission of the Chairman, speak shortly in explanation, but he must concisely state the point he desires to explain and keep strictly to that point;
- (l) A member may at any time address the Chair on a point of order arising during the debate, but must confine his observations strictly thereto;
- (m) The decision of the Chairman shall be final upon all points of order.

RESCINDING OF RESOLUTIONS:

No resolution of the Council shall be rescinded or altered within three months of the same having been passed, except at a Special Meeting to be called for the purpose, and at which meeting an absolute majority of the whole Council shall be present and vote for such rescinding or altering.

ORDER OF DEBATE:

- (a) Every Motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded and when this has been done it shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the majority of the members present;
- (b) Every Amendment shall be relevant to the Motion on which it is moved, and no substantive motion shall be received under colour of an amendment;
- (c) When an amendment to a Motion has been moved and seconded, no other amendment shall be moved until the first has been disposed of;
- (d) If an amendment has been rejected, other amendments, in order, may be moved on the original Motion;
- (e) If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion and shall become the main question, upon which any further amendment may be moved;
- (f) A Motion or Amendment may be amended by the mover and seconder with the consent of the majority of the members present;
- (g) A Motion "that the Council do now adjourn" or "that the Council do now proceed to the next business or "that the debate be now adjourned" may be moved at any time, but no speech shall be allowed in moving or seconding either motion, and no second or further motion to the same effect shall be made within half an hour;
- (h) A member when speaking to a resolution, shall stand and address the Chair, and if two or more members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall decide to whom priority shall be given;
- (i) A member shall direct his speech strictly to the motion or amendment under discussion, or to a motion or amendment to be proposed by himself, or to a question of order;
- (j) A member shall not address the Council more than once on any motion or amendment, except as hereafter provided, but the mover of an original motion may reply and in his reply shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate, but the mover of an amendment shall have no right of reply.
- (k) A member may, by permission of the Chairman, speak shortly in explanation, but he must concisely state the point he desires to explain and keep strictly to that point;
- (l) A member may at any time address the Chair on a point of order arising during the debate, but must confine his observations strictly thereto;
- (m) The decision of the Chairman shall be final upon all points of order.

RESCINDING OF RESOLUTIONS:

No resolution of the Council shall be rescinded or altered within three months of the same having been passed, except at a Special Meeting to be called for the purpose, and at which meeting an absolute majority of the whole Council shall be present and vote for such rescinding or altering.





Bowls and croquet under lights

Bowls by gaslight was the novel form of entertainment which Mr A.M. Myers, president of the Auckland Bowling Club, and his mother, Mrs Louis Myers, provided for some thousand guests at the Grafton Green last night. Although the devotees of "ye ancient game" are noted for the unlimited amount of time they bestow upon their favourite pastime, it is doubtful whether before they have ever carried out the game quite so far into the night.

By a happy adaption of the evening garden fetes which are characteristic of Paris and other Continental cities, Mr Myers introduced something quite new in the way of entertaining, which will long be remembered by bowlers and their friends.

The Grafton Greens are very pretty at any time, but last night they were most picturesque. At various points powerful incandescent gas lamps, the stands decorated with nikau, were erected, making the place almost as light as day. The fence at the Domain side of the ground was thickly hung with varicoloured fairy lights, while more were scattered with glow-worm effect in the shrubberies on the sloping banks at the opposite sides of the ground.

The tout ensemble was very gay and through the shrubberies fell the bright light on a very busy





My DEAR MURIEL.—

Last Thursday was a great day for the Auckland Croquet Club. Progressive cro-

quet matches were arranged, and the lawn presented quite a gay and animated appearance, and altogether the members and their visitors had a most enjoyable time. Mrs Bramhall and Mrs Steele were the lucky prize winners, and, when I saw them take home with them, felt almost inclined to forsake tennis and take to the more sedate game. Mrs Bramhall, who is a visitor to Auckland, is a splendid player, and has succeeded in winning any number of matches. She naturally takes a great interest in the Auckland club, and intends giving a prize to be competed for next year. When I tell you that Iredale provided the refreshments you will know that the inner woman was well looked after. To judge from the frequent 'Excuse me' uttered in frigidly polite accents by one player to another, with reference to the position of the ball, I should think any amount of cheating was indulged in by croquet players. A dose of truth is so often administered with lots of civility, I presume to take away the nasty taste. In my opinion it makes the flavour much worse.

I could not help noticing how beautifully fresh and green the bowling greens looked, and wondered why it was allowed that they should be freely watered while the poor vegetable and flower gardens are left to the mercy of caterpillars and other pests brought on by want of water. main unaltered. The club's grounds will be formally opened for play on Saturday, November 2, when a good muster of members, friends, and representatives of other clubs is confidently anticipated.

The following report was presented to members of the Auckland Tennis Club at the meeting held during the week:— "Your committee, in laying the result of the last season's operations before you, have pleasure in stating that, in spite of the difficulties they had to contend with, the past season on the whole was fairly satisfactory. The courts, both tennis and croquet, were kept fully occupied during the season, and the interest in both games fairly sustained, and while your committee could not fail to see that the courts were not quite up to requirements for first-class play, they felt it impossible to do more than palliate the more glaring defects, leaving their removal to the close season; and with the object of making the green more desirable for play, and to give more room for the croquet section, proposed to re-form the courts, and for that purpose called a meeting of members, who unanimously resolved that a call of 10s per member be made for that purpose. A contract was let and the work done, and although not altogether to the satisfaction of your committee, you will no doubt find the green a vast improvement on former years, while the space available has been increased. The call was responded to by 33 members, 22 tennis and 11 croquet, out of a roll of 66 members; but as 12 have left the district or resigned, it only leaves 16 on the roll who have not up to the present paid. This left the committee short of funds, but three members of committee gave donations, and loaned the club a considerable sum to tide over difficulties, and order material from England for the next season's play; also some private members gave donations. Thus the balance sheet, which shows total receipts from all sources, £105 16s 2d, and expenditure £96 5s 2d, leaves a balance in hand of £9 11s, against which there are outstanding liabilities, including the loans aforesaid, of about £50; but as in this sum is included the new racquet balls, nets, croquet sets, etc., there will only be a deficiency to make up of about £25, which the committee hope, with an increased membership, and a slight increase of subscriptions, which your committee recommend should be—for gentlemen, 25s, and ladies as before, with an entrance fee of 10s 2d.
