
GLEN EDEN CLUB.

GLEN EDEN'S OPENING.

Under ideal conditions the Glen Eden bowling and croquet greens were opened for the season on Saturday. The pavilion was gaily decorated for the occasion, and there was a good attendance. The weather was all that could be desired for the function. All present sang the National Anthem. Apologies were received from Sir James Gunson and others for not being present. Mr. Mason, M.P. for Eden, was prevented from being in attendance at the opening ceremony, owing to trouble with his car. Mr. Mason, however, arrived later in the afternoon. Mr. Martin, chairman of the Glen Eden Town Board, made some congratulatory remarks.

Mr. N. S. Fox, president of the Bowling Club, welcomed the visitors, including Messrs. Reid and Clarke, representing the Auckland centre. Brief complimentary remarks were made by both gentlemen in response.

Mrs. Fox, president of the croquet Club, then rolled the "jack" across the green, and her husband declared it open for play.

The visitors then adjourned to the croquet green, where Mr. Reid called upon Miss Audley to drive up the ball, and play followed.

Despite bad weather a very large crowd assembled on the green for the opening of the Glen Eden Bowling and Croquet Club. The president (Mr. Perkins) in declaring the green open referred to the excellent condition of the green and lawns, which was a result of the special treatment recommended by the Auckland centre. He then called upon Mrs. Perkins to throw the jack, but owing to the heavy rain play was impossible. Representatives of various clubs were present, among whom was Mr. J. W. Hardley of the Auckland Centre. He addressed the gathering and gave a short history of the game in New Zealand, of which the Auckland Club was the pioneer. The local member, Mr. H. G. R. Mason, M.P., was also present, and in his address he spoke of the great benefit that daylight saving was to the sporting community.

The opening of the croquet lawns took place also. Mr. Perkins called upon Mrs. S. G. Hosking to drive the first ball. Percent were served by the
